

Coordinating and Subordinating Conjunctions

Coordinating Conjunctions (FANBOYS):

Coordinating conjunctions are used to join two independent clauses. We would either join the independent clauses with a semicolon (;), or a comma and a coordinating conjunction.

For - And - Nor - But - Or - Yet - So

Common Subordinating Conjunctions:

Subordinating conjunction is used to join independent clauses to dependent clauses. It illustrates the importance of the independent clause, and at the same time provides a transition between two ideas in the same sentence. When the subordinating clause is used first, we put a comma as a punctuation after it and before the independent clause.

Subordinating Conjunctions	Meaning
After, as soon as, as long as, before, once, still, until, when, whenever, while	Time-related Conjunctions
Although, as though, even though, just as, though, whereas, in contrast to	Concession and Comparison Conjunctions
As, because, in order that, since, so that	Cause Conjunctions
Even if, if, in case, provided that, unless	Condition Conjunctions
Where, wherever, whereas	Place Conjunctions
